The CJCC's mission is to assist in making sustainable, data-driven improvements to Charleston County's criminal justice system and thereby improve public safety and community well-being.

The CJCC will consider the input and voices of the community representatives in its decision- making process. One member will be elected by the other members of this group and will have full voting rights. The CJCC is looking for representation from five areas for the 2022–2024 term to join those currently serving the 2021-2023 term.

Community representatives are respectfully requested to attend CJCC meetings and actively participate in community engagement efforts. Representatives may not serve more than two consecutive terms.
