**40%** of GS releases on bond in 2014 returned to jail pretrial (at least 1x)



Of the 40% that failed. they often failed repeatedly

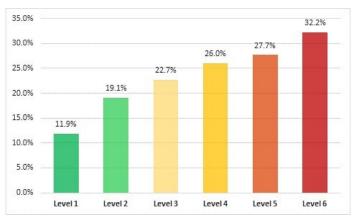
4,289 pretrial service reports to court

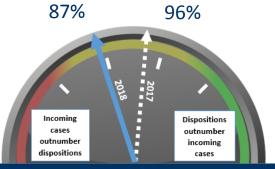
